OUR PAST

Prior to 1961, families in Essex County came together to demand and create services and supports for their children. Supporters began with a one room school house with one teacher, four students and a borrowed station wagon.

In September, 1961 the organization was incorporated and is now one of hundreds of Community Living organizations in Ontario serving people who have an intellectual disability and is part of a network of thousands involved in community living supports across Canada.

OUR PRESENT

Community Living Essex County has a strong membership governed by a volunteer Board of Directors, elected annually, and consisting of family members, advocates and other community leaders.

As a fully accredited organization through Focus Accreditation, supports and services are provided to over 700 children, youth and adults who have an intellectual disability and their families throughout Essex County. Supports include individualized supported community living options, community involvement supports, virtual supports, employment supports, short break or respite supports, Special Services at Home (for children) and Passport (for adults). We work in partnership with Ensemble (family leadership) and New Day (advocacy and leadership) – we believe we are stronger together!
